Perhaps you have a student or students who could help us develop a plan for making our archive available to the public. Maybe you have students able to actually help us organize and digitize the information. We cannot pay for their work but we are more than happy to verify the work accomplished and support the academic processes of your institution.

For our part, we will treat your students as full partners and honor their contribution with the same respect in which we hold the work of the people whose service we seek to honor. We are open to your suggestions and eager to cooperate with fellow professionals.
